

Dialogue Summary

From November 20, 2023, to January 12, 2024, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), in collaboration with the U.S. Department of Labor's (DOL) Office of Disability Employment Policy's (ODEP) ePolicyWorks initiative, hosted the Exploring the Future of Public Transportation Research National Online Dialogue to gather insights, experiences, and suggestions from a broad group of subject matter experts and stakeholders, including people with disabilities. This input will contribute to a five-year FTA strategic research plan designed to address the most pressing public transportation challenges and advance the highest impact transformations.

Key Themes and Takeaways from the Dialogue

- Accelerate the adoption of new transit technologies
- Address transportation challenges in underserved communities
- **Adopt** a disability-forward approach to create a more inclusive and accessible transportation system
- **Conduct** research to understand and address transit demand
- Encourage standardization, simplification, and user-centric design
- Ensure safety in public transit
- **Explore** the potential of autonomous electric vehicles (AEVs)
- Investigate zero emission busses and other ways to lower emissions
- Involve diverse perspectives in transit innovation
- Leverage emerging technologies and sustainability efforts
- Optimize existing railroad infrastructure
- **Prioritize** accessibility and safety in transportation design and implementation
- **Support** collaboration among agencies and innovative funding approaches
- Utilize data to inform future research and innovation



Dialogue Participation Summary



ePolicyWorks conducted 13 distinct email campaigns to promote the online dialogue. In total, 28,032 emails were delivered to ePolicyWorks stakeholders promoting the dialogue, with an open rate of more than 32%, which is more than nine percentage points better than recent ePolicyWorks dialogue outreach campaigns and 15 percentage points higher than the industry average of 17%. In addition,10% of individuals who opened an outreach email clicked on at least one link in the email.



Sponsored by the U.S. Department of Labor's Office of Disability Employment Policy (ODEP), ePolicyWorks leverages crowdsourcing to inform inclusive workforce policymaking by engaging citizens and stakeholders around advancing employment for people with disabilities. This innovative approach reflects a change in how stakeholders connect and collaborate with the Federal Government and each other, thereby increasing the efficiency of a participatory policymaking process.
